Karen Robinson was a contributor to the Less Toxic Guide in the 1997 print form and the new on-line Guide 2006.

Karen served on the Advisory Council of the Health Canada/Environment Canada Chemicals Management Plan which is mentioned on p. 2, 3, 6, 10,11, 13, &14. Triclosan, bisphenols and many other hazardous chemicals were identified and preventive action taken. She took part from its inception until her retirement in 2017.
